Channel One Food Bank and Food Shelf staff, member agencies, volunteers and donors worked hard in the 2009-2010 Fiscal Year to continue to strengthen our mission of working in partnership with others to help feed people in need. Due to the unfortunate changes in our economy, more



people than ever are struggling with hunger. On behalf of the over 80,000 clients that we served last year, thank you to all of our agencies, donors, volunteers and staff who worked so hard in support of our hunger relief efforts in Southeastern Minnesota and La Crosse County, Wisconsin.

Channel One Hunger Relief Programs: Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Recap

Channel One Food Bank, a member of Feeding America, the nation's network of food banks, received and distributed over 7.3 million pounds of product during the year. This food was distributed through Channel One's local supplemental food shelf program and 199 member agency programs, including 53 food shelves, in 101 non-profit organizations that serve those in need in Southeast Minnesota and Western Wisconsin.

The Supplemental Food Shelf saw sharp increases in the number of visits to the food shelf and in the number of new households registering for assistance. Overall the food shelf received 41,939 visits during the year. The food shelf served 8,177 registered households, which is a 45% increase over the previous year. 3,104,835 pounds of food, an increase of 8% over last fiscal year, were distributed through the food shelf. The average number of pounds distributed per visit was 74 pounds.

The food shelf program operates at Channel One's main site in Southeast Rochester and has satellite food shelves in Byron, Stewartville, Oronoco, Oasis Church in northwest Rochester, and in downtown Rochester at the Salvation Army.

The Mothers and Children Program (MAC) and the Nutrition Assistance Program for Seniors (NAPS) provided government commodity food packages throughout Channel One's thirteen Minnesota counties. The commodity food boxes are distributed once a month to qualifying infants, children, women, and seniors. During FY 09-10 Channel One distributed 1,203 food boxes through the MAC program, and 16,351 through the NAPS program.

Employed for part of FY 09-10

The work of providing food assistance throughout a 14-county service area requires exceptional assistance from the community to support these efforts. Between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010 nearly 2,000 individuals contributed 18,621 hours of service to Channel One programs. This is the equivalent of an additional nine staff members at Channel One. These hours include volunteer efforts repacking bulk food donations, assisting customers in the food shelf, service on the Board of Directors, working in the Channel One Green Garden, stocking the food shelf, and packing MAC and NAPS food packages. The efforts of these tremendous individuals assist Channel One in providing quality service to those in need.
