Last year when we sent out our Annual Report, I was able to share with you the beginnings of a journey that we were undertaking to improve Channel One's capacity to meet the needs of increasing numbers of people struggling with hunger in Southeast Minnesota and Western Wisconsin. What a journey the last year has been! We broke ground on our warehouse expansion in October, and despite Mother Nature's best efforts with a very cold and windy winter, we finished the main part of the warehouse expansion in May. Our new repack room that will be used to get food ready for distribution is almost finished. Crews are working daily to enlarge the freezer and cooler by 50%. And we plan to break ground on our new teaching kitchen and community classroom in just a couple of weeks. All of this work is made possible by our generous donors whose contributions to the campaign are feeding people and changing lives. We are grateful for ALL of the donors to the campaign, both large and small. We are also grateful to everyone who spread the word and voted, making Channel One the first ever All Star Game Fans Choose \$500,000 grant winner from the Minnesota Twins, the Pohlad Family Foundation, the Twins Community Fund and Major League Baseball!

As I have shared before, our facility expansion is necessary so that Channel One can continue to meet the needs of those struggling with hunger throughout our service area. In our last fiscal year, we distributed nearly 9.5 million pounds of food to approximately 100,000 people in Southeast Minnesota and Western Wisconsin. We distributed 15% more produce this year than last – a whopping 1.7 million pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables.

What has really made our journey over the past year amazing are the people who are part of it. We are blessed with wonderful staff, fantastic agency partners, generous donors and incredible volunteers – over 2,300 this past fiscal year – who walk with us on this journey. But the really special part of this journey are our clients...the little boy whose eyes lit up when his mom handed him a fresh apple to eat that she had just received in our food shelf. Or the senior who wiped away tears as a volunteer helped her load her cart with enough food to fill her pantry. Or the single father who was able to take a deep breath and stand up tall, knowing he now had enough food to feed his two kids until his next payday. Those

This past fiscal year, Channel One volunteers donated 29,030 hours - enough time to equal 14 fulltime staff members! Volunteers play an integral role in helping Channel One Regional Food Bank help feed people in need. We appreciate the variety of talents and interests that our volunteers bring to the table at Channel One to help us continue to carry out our work in the fight against hunger.

Here is a story of some of our volunteers who joined together to utilize their creative talents to benefit our hunger relief programs at Channel One:

On June 9, 2013. Colleen Worisek, Jane Mervosh and Becky Meyerhofer started a project called Cards for a Cause as a way to raise



money for Channel One. Cards for a Cause volunteers create greeting cards, which are sold in three locations around Rochester: FloRae Hair Salon, Pirkl Chiropractic, and Hank and Purl Knitting Shop. Cards for a Cause contributes all of the supplies used to create the cards and donates 100% of its sales to Channel One. To date, these volunteers have raised enough money to provide food equal to 15,000 meals to our community members in need!

Colleen Worisek, a Cards for a Cause founder and volunteer, said, "We have found this project to be very rewarding and are so pleased with the success we have had selling our cards. At a cost of only \$2 a card, this amounts to us selling 1,500 greeting cards to benefit Channel One! The businesses who sell our cards have been very happy to support Channel One through card sales as well. We look forward to seeing Cards for a Cause grow, and our donations increase as time goes on. We know the funds we have raised are well used by Channel One as the needs in our community continue to grow."
